Curriculum



Welcome to Year Four and another year at Windaroo State School.

We would like to welcome Charlotte Leman to Year Four. She has experience in teaching and is able to cater to students and their differing needs. We're looking forward to seeing what she brings to the Year Four team!

In Term 1, students will develop routine and focus on the fundamentals of English, Mathematics and other Key Learning Areas.

In **English** students will write a narrative. Considering they have already written a narrative in Year Three, they will need to develop their skills in Year Four. Sentence structure is therefore a focus, as well as how they have conveyed a message. Students will learn how to read a text and respond to a variety of questions in a program that is tailored to their needs. Students will do this in small groups with an aide.


In **Mathematics** students will look at place value, addition and subtraction and briefly, multiplication. In Term 1 students need to focus on and improve mental computation. They will therefore look at and use a range of mental and written strategies. There will be opportunities for students to solve problems involving two operations (+-). One-step and two-step problems will be introduced to students and they will develop their use of relative strategies.

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This term in **Science**, the students will be learning about living things. Students will look at the lifecycle of living things and how the environment can affect it.

Students will identify whether something is prey or a predator. They will then discuss how this can affect the lifecycle of a living thing.

As a part of this unit and to help students understand the lifecycle, they will plant sunflowers in the garden bed outside the science room. Students often enjoy this as they can watch the plants grow and see their beauty.



In our **Health** unit students will look at and discuss the importance of nutrition. Students will look at the value of carbohydrates, fats and protein in our diet. Students will then look at the link between diet and exercise. With their understanding of this, they will write a meal plan that has suggestions of different exercises that they could suggest to a friend.

Swimming

General Information
